Cienfuegos: The Pearl of the South



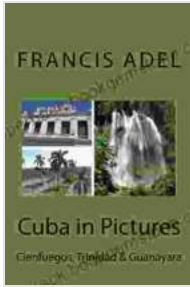

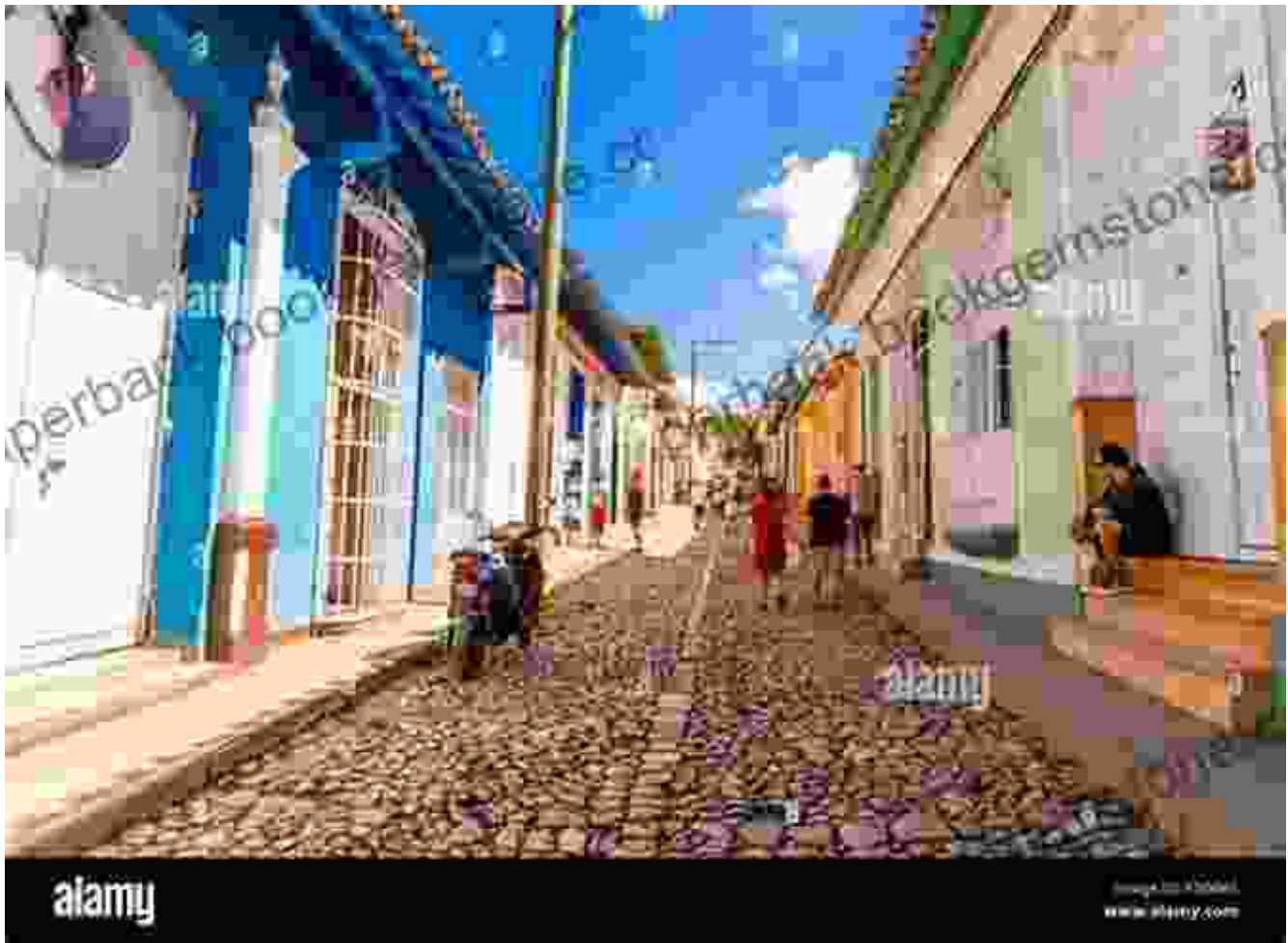

Guanayara: A Pristine Beach Paradise

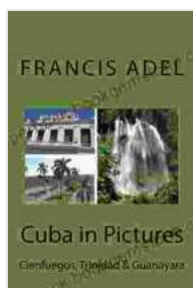

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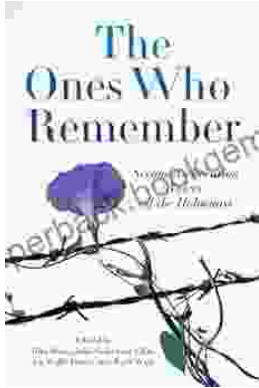
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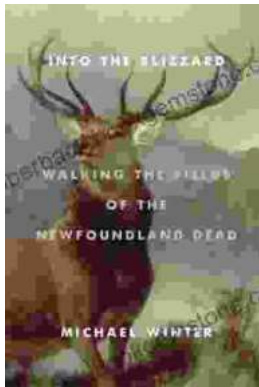
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
