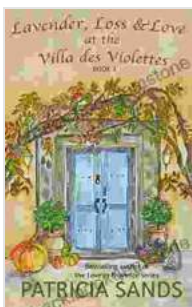


# Lavender Loss: Love Lost at the Villa des Violettes

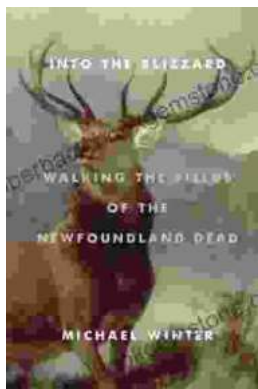
