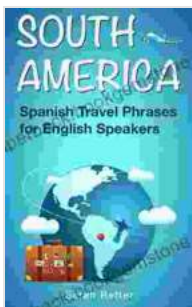


# The Most Useful Phrases to Get Around When Travelling in South America

- Have fun! Learning a language should be an enjoyable experience.

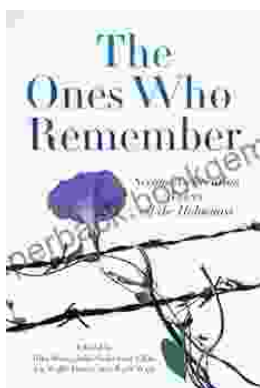

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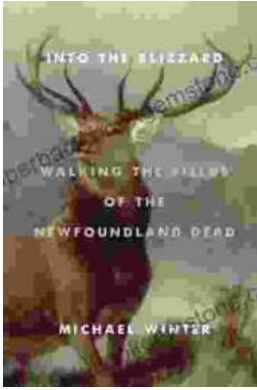
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
